



They are quickly adapting to the school's routines and are working hard across their lessons.



#### YEAR 8: THE PHILOSOPHER

As we near the half way point of our first half term with our new Year 8 students, it is clear to see that they are all truly getting to grips with life as The Philosopher. To be a philosopher, one must develop a critical eye, a skill that students have been seen developing their English lessons as they investigate the text of Sherlock Holmes through analysis. They must learn to question and experiment with outcomes, a skill honed in their science and maths lessons. They must question their understanding of the world, a skill focused upon in their Personal Development lessons whilst exploring peer pressure and mental health. They must discern assumptions, which is developed in their history and religious lessons as they explore society's past. Finally, a good Philosopher, must train their ability to criticise which is seen when they are giving feedback both on their own work and that of others across subjects.

To further develop their understanding of The Philosopher and engage in the Stoke Park Experience, students have been tasked with selecting a Famous Philosopher to represent their tutor group, someone who they believe is a good role model for them based on their attributes. Our Inventors have hit the ground running with their GCSE classes and feedback around students has been fantastic. This week in Personal Development we have been talking about student leadership- how we can get more of our students to represent our school and help to implement positive changes. One way we are all getting involved in this is this year's charity event that we are launching after the half-term. Students are all going to be encouraged to raise £10 via sponsorships (ie a sponsored walk), an example being led by Mr Grimwood as he is raising money by partaking in 'Movember'. We are hoping to raise as much as possible for MIND- the mental health charity. Students have also spent time this week in Personal Development talking about how to best take care of their mental health, especially now they are older and may face different pressures in their GCSE classes.

Attendance and punctuality have become an even bigger focus for the inventors of the school. Thank you to parents and carers for their continued support in ensuring that students attend school each day and arrive promptly for their 8:40 start. Students who have above 95% attendance achieve on average half a grade more than their peers.
