WIMBLEDON



On Wednesday 10th July eight students were rewarded for their excellence this year in Physical Education by being selected to attend the Wimbledon Championships 2024. With it being the 10th day of the Championships students were treated to two exciting quarter-final matches across both the Women Single's and Men Single's competition.

The tickets we had for Court No.1 became even more exclusive with the news that the Men's quarter final happening on Centre Court had been given as a walkover win due to a late injury-induced player withdrawal.

The first match we watched was a straight sets win by world number 32 Krejcikova over world number 14 Ostapenko. The second set was particularly thrilling as it ended with a tie-break. The second match on Court Number One was between world number 14 Taylor Fritz and world number 25 Lorenzo Musetti. Students were treated to a five-set thriller in which momentum swung back and forth with Italian player Musetti eventually prevailing as the winner! Students were astounded by the athleticism on display, in particular the speed at which players serve and strike the ball. Students were also able to explore the Wimbledon grounds, which are renowned as being the most prestigious tennis courts in the world. On Monday 24th June, 32 year 9 and year 10 students attended the Earth Summit at Keele University. The Earth Summit is an annual 2-day event that provides students with a chance to take part in a wide-ranging examination of the factors causing climate change, the effects it is having on biodiversity, promoting sustainably at home, at school and in the community.

The workshops provide valuable experiences that students can take with them to champion sustainability in their careers. Planet-first changes can be implemented in all types of work, whether it's improving the sustainability of supply chains, nurturing sustainable

In The Bridge last week, students had some amazing cultural, experiences through performing in Sister Act, visiting Coventry Transport Museum, visiting Leicester University and reflecting on their time in The Bridge.

7KHU and 7BDJ had an amazing opportunity to visit the University of Leicester where students were able to experience campus life, participate in interactive workshops and explore what life would be like if they aspire to attend a university. All students demonstrated PRIDE throughout the day and had many opportunities to showcase their oracy skills through the formal discussions, conversations with university students and responding to the sessions. Feedback from our host at the university, shared this lovely feedback which is a credit to all students that attended: *'I just wanted to reach out to say that it was a pleasure welcoming the group onto campus on Friday. Another amazing culturally enriching experience was for 7JTO who attended Coventry Transport Museum. Students took part in a workshop on the future of transport. Having learnt about the importance of Coventry as a car manufacturer in Geography lessons, this was an amazing opportunity to see some of the historic cars in person. Following a tour around the museum, including stops at the vehicle that holds the current World Land Speed Record, students were given the opportunity to design their own 'future car'. Working in groups, they were given the brief to design a car that prioritised not just speed but sustainability. Students enjoyed the creativity involved in first drawing, and then modelling their cars out of clay, as well as competing with one another to win 'best car design'.

In lessons, students have been reflecting on their journey in Year 7 by delving into their wider learning journeys from September to July; reflecting on how much they have achieved in their subjects over the years. Not only reflecting on Year 7, but students have also been readily preparing for their journey to The Gateway where their oracy skills will develop and transform into philosophical skills.

In tutor time this week, students have been readily preparing for their Showcase Speeches next week. All students are incredibly excited to showcase their journey in The Bridge and this is a fantastic opportunity for all students to highlight themselves as an articulate orator after almost completing their first step on the seven-year-journey at Stoke Park School.
