


WIN A KINDLE!

MOCK FEEDBACK AND NEXT STEPS

Now that our Year 10 Inventor's have finished their mocks, the next few weeks are key to understand how they need to improve. These feedback lessons are vital in ensuring they know what they need to do to maintain their grade or boost up to the next level. Being an Inventor instils in our students the understanding that they may not always succeed first time, but that, through showing resilience, determination and reflecting on how to improve, they can rapidly advance and develop. As Inventors the Year 10s are now learning from any mistakes made in their mocks so they can tailor their revision at home to how they are currently working. Attendance and being on time is therefore still a massive priority as students are having these valuable conversations.

Additionally, many of our students are now completing vital coursework for their subjects. This opportunity to independently develop their own work, making use of wider research and knowledge, is a key part of their development. Students will need to use all of their skills as the Inventor, in order to ensure they produce the highest standard of work. As with ensuring students are in school for feedback for their mocks, attendance is extremely important over the coming weeks for all students, to ensure they have the best opportunity and amount of time to work on their coursework.

They will use these skills and their CV later in the year when they have local professionals and external interviewers come in to school in order to conduct practice interviews with them. These will be a fantastic opportunity for students to network and develop their careers skills, whilst also preparing them for potential interviews for Post-16 or other routes. During Careers week we will also invite many of these businesses in for our careers fair, which all of the students will experience.
