Students who have above 95% attendance achieve on average half a grade more than their peers.



#### **Year 7 Coventry Schools Athletics**

On Wednesday 5th June selected students from year 7 participated in the Coventry Schools Athletics event taking place at University of Warwick Athletics Track. The event involves all students from Coventry-based schools. All Stoke Park students displayed excellent levels of resilience and determination in their events. As this was a qualifying event students needed to finish with a time or distance that was in the top 8 to qualify for the finals event that will take place on Wednesday 26th June. Excitingly, two year 7 students qualified for multiple events! Joel. Q displayed superb race tactics to win his 150m and 600m race heat and qualified in second place for the long jump. Blake. K excelled in the javelin, qualifying in 2nd place. Blake has also manged to qualify for the 75m hurdles event. The year 7

# **BOOK OF THE WEEK**


Selected this week is the first of an incredibly successful book (and somewhat film) franchise, The Maze
