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

The Spring term will see our year 12 acting on all these opportunities to shape their understandings of career choices and their next academic steps. In this competitive world, these opportunities are crucial to the success of the Stoke Park Scholar. A reminder that our first round of mock exams will begin in January week commencing 13th January 2025, usually these exams take place during the lesson time but a timetable will be given to year 12 prior to this week. It us essential before the students leave to have spoken to subject teachers so they leave with an understanding of what to revise for when. The mock exams and subsequent report generated will be an important landmark moment along our Post 16 journey.



YEAR 13 UPDATE

They have been involved in mock exams to fully prepare themselves for the summer, we have begun intervention, and personal statements have been completed to complement their applications to Post 18 providers; whether that be University, Apprenticeships or anything in between and onwards.


